Sometimes, they even steal food from other birds, which shows just how clever and opportunistic they can be.



Having shared about their eating habits, it's time to talk about their life cycle and relationship with us humans. Bald eagles mate for life, and they return to the same nest each year to lay 1 to 3 eggs, which hatch after about 35 days. Humans and bald eagles have a mixed history - while some people admire their beauty and strength, others see them as competition for fish and game. Despite past threats, such as hunting and pesticide exposure, conservation efforts have helped bald eagle populations recover, and they continue to inspire us with their majestic presence and symbolize freedom in the United States.
